Description

Premium eggshell finish paint with low volatile organic compound (VOCs) emissions. It contains no lead or mercury. It is super adherent, opaque, does not turn yellow, does not splatter and has light odour. This paint is ideal for walls with surface irregularities. It is very washable and scrub resistant.

Application

Shake the container well before applying the paint. Use a spatula to stir all the way to the bottom of the container. Apply with a synthetic fibre brush (polyester, nylon) and a good quality lint-free roller 10 mm (0.5"). For spray gun application, it is important to dilute the product 10-15 % with water to obtain a uniform application. Never apply below 10 °C (50 °F) and above 32 °C (90 °F). Humidity level should be lower than 50 %. Ventilate the room well. Two coats should be applied for best product performance.

Storage

Keep in a dry, well-ventilated place at a moderate temperature (about 20°C (68 °F). Avoid freezing.

* Also available in pearl finish, ultra-washable. Ideal for doors & frames.

Care instructions

It is best to use a soft cloth or sponge and a mild household soap. Do not use abrasive cleaners. Rinse off soap residue thoroughly. To achieve full performance of this paint wait at least 3-4 weeks before doing a first wash.

Surface preparation

Surface preparation is paramount and the final success of the project depends on it. All surfaces must be clean, dry and free of all traces of contaminants, mould and peeling paint. High gloss surfaces should be sanded to allow better adhesion of the paint. Remove old, peeling paint. Thoroughly clean the surface to be painted with a trisodium phosphate solution (TSP). Rinse well and leave to dry.

- Bare wood: Apply a bleed-proof latex primer for this purpose (pine, spruce, maple). It is important to seal the knots well. Some woods require the use of a product such as than Shellac on the knots.
- New gypsum: The plaster must be completely dry and clean before applying the paint. Apply the primer-sealer 1840-05AC Prime3.
- Previously latex-painted surfaces: Apply a coat of latex primer 1840-05AC Prime3.

- · Previously alkyd-painted surfaces: If the existing alkyd coat has a matte finish, apply the latex primer 1840-05AC Prime3, but if the finish is glossy, sand the surface to allow the latex primer to adhere.
- New concrete and masonry: Concrete must be completely dry before applying paint. Clean with muriatic acid and rinse well with water. Apply a coat of latex primer 1840-05AC Prime3.
- Metals: Prepare the surface with a primer for metal, then apply paint according to application instructions.

Note: Do not use this paint on floors.
